## MOSTLY MOZART, TOO

Under the direction of cellist David Finckel of the Emerson String Quartet, and his wife and business partner, pianist Wu Han, the annual Music@Menlo festival has gained a reputation for excellence, both for its engaging chamber-music workshops and its brilliant performance series. The 2006 concert series, built around the 250th anniversary of Mozart's birth, provides material for the stunning seven-CD box set Return-

ing to Mozart. The discs pair Mozart works with various other composers grouped in themed volumes dedicated to Shostakovich, the piano, the string quartet, winds, 20thcentury music, Britten, and Messiaen's Quartet for the End of Time. Featured string players, culled from the festival's stellar faculty, include violinists Jorja Fleezanis, Joseph Silverstein, Jennifer Frautschi, Ani Kavafian, Tien-Hsin Wu; violists Paul Neubauer and CarlaMaria Rodrigues; cellists Finckel, Colin Carr, and Peter Wiley; bassist Scott Pingel;
